Of course every Tuesday from the 18th onwards members can simply come along if they want to enjoy each others company for some social time over a cup of tea or coffee. Please come along and help where you can.

Safety

Naturally to operate machinery in the shed, Safety is a major concern for all of us.

Every member is responsible for their own safety!

If you plan to do any work in the shed, you are being asked to bring your own personal safety protection such as safety glasses, ear protectors, gloves and dust masks.

Another key issue is the appointment of Supervisors to keep an eye on any members who might be using unsafe practices. Following the recent Questionnaire, we have managed to get six offers to takeon this role, but we would like to get several more volunteers so that the duty only comes up for each one less often. The duties are not onerous and guidance will be given.

Basically, we are asking members and supporters to log onto the website (by clicking on the link shown in blue below), click the "Proceed to Page" Button if it appears.


