MEMBER SKILLS AND ACTIVITIES

Raffle Organiser Needed

We have been given some Ozito tools which we need to raffle and we are looking for someone to run the raffle. This should not prove to be an onerous task, but it needs looking after if it is to be successful.

Guild of Woodworkers Wellington (GWW)

Woodturning by an expert

On Saturday March 16, The Guild of Woodworkers Wellington (GWW) held a joint meeting with MenzShed Tawa to demonstrate the "art" of woodturning. The presenter was Chris Hooton, also known as "Woody" who is based in Taupo. The Tawa MenzShed proved an ideal location for the event and, with two cameras and monitors to provide close-ups while Woody was working his magic; everyone was able to see what was happening. He started his demonstration by converting a short length of plum tree branch (with bark) into a shallow tray and followed this up by producing a highly polished bowl from a block of Kohekohe. All this was done without measurements. Instead, he used his eyes, the feel of the wood, and his long experience to produce the finished bowl.

Safety

Health and Safety is each individual's responsibility. Also, as a member of the shed, please look out for fellow members and help and advise them if you see them struggling with a tool or using them incorrectly.

Here are some basic common sense safety reminders that you are aware of.

Always ? WEAR EYE PROTECTION.

- Use tools that are the RIGHT SIZE & RIGHT TYPE for your job.
- Follow the correct procedure for using EVERY tool.
- Keep your cutting tools SHARP and in good condition
- DON'T work with OILY or GREASY hands.
- Handle SHARP-EDGED and POINTED TOOLS with care.
- Always carry pointed tools by your side with the points and heavy ends DOWN.
- SECURE all small work & short work with a vise or clamp.
- NEVER carry tools in your pockets.
- DON'T use tools which are LOOSE or CRACKED.
- KEEP your punches & chisels in good condition. Mushroomed heads can chip & cause injuries.
- DON'T use a file without a HANDLE.
- DON'T pry or hammer with a FILE. It may shatter.
