## Shed news.

\*There has been a steady turnout to recent Shed open sessions on Tuesday and Saturday mornings 10am - 1pm. Attendance is normally around 6-12 people.

\*Geoff has done a superb job at tidying and keeping in its place all of the tools and consumables that reside on the shelving and tool room at the back right corner of the shed. He is there most sessions so if you're looking for a particular size screw or screw driver please just ask Geoff. It would be a great help to Jeff and the Shed if at the end of each session tools and items you're removed from shelving could be returned to where you found them. This also helps keep the Shed looking tidy and professional.

\*In this regards it would also help if before you left the Shed session that you sweep up the area you've been working in. Dust and sawdust is getting everywhere and it shouldn't be left to others to tidy up after you.

\*Electricians have been on site in the past week and have tested and certified a number of electrical hand tools and are working on getting the remaining lathe operational.

\*Bryan has installed a repaired band-saw blade and is currently working on a dust extraction system for the lathes. When the lathes get their electrical certification, Bryan plans to run a few workshops instructing interested members how to carve.

\*At long last the Shed has been given approval from WCC for a new door to be placed between the Shed and kitchen area which will remove the necessity to walk around the outside between these areas. However, an LBP is required to supervise this work and Howard is arranging this aspect and then the action can begin.
