Gary Beecroft, Chairpersons Report 16 September 2021



This is the fifth year of the MenzShed Tawa, (MZT) and each year the Society increases its services to members and its impact on the Tawa Community and continues to make organisational progress.

There are several reasons for our continuing success, community impact, and development:

- The most important is that a group of Tawa people enjoy making things together and the fellowship that brings. Supported by an excellent committee of very committed members.
- This spirit, ethos, the increasing availability of high-quality equipment is easily demonstrated, and as a result the MZT has seen a significant increase in younger members in this financial year.
- Another significant contribution to success is the commitment of the committee, supervisors, and members to making the MZT work and to contribute to our community.
- We continue to receive significant help from the WCC with grants for equipment, rental conditions, and maintenance of our building.
- We have also received funding support from the St David's Fund, Lotto, Carbatec NZ, and Cabot's, and facilities support from the Rural Fire Service.
- Although projects come and go, collective groups within the Shed currently have 6 funded projects for the community, one WCC funded project, and a further 10 MZT funded projects.

Membership and Finances

This year our financial members have continued to increase with 74 financial members and our newsletter email out goes to over 130 people or organisations, complemented by a very good website. Our financial position has strengthened, and our range of quality equipment for our use has increased. We have also seen formal connection created with the Woodworkers Guild, Friends of the Tawa Bush Reserves and Tawa College Community Education.

Upgrading Equipment

We received a grant from WCC, Lotto, and the St David Fund which allowed us to purchase a new Drill Press, Rail Saw, Stop Saw and Router Table. These purchases significantly improved the standard of equipment at the MZT.

Availability for Members

To improve the engagement with working members, committee meeting have been moved at Monday nights. Members are welcome to attend if they wish. Due to several new younger members the MZT, now opens a Sundays with new members often acting as supervisors.

Expanded Community Services with Tawa College

During the latter part of this financial year the MZT and Community Education Department of Tawa College entered into an agreement to run the Community Education Adult Woodwork Classes from the MZT on Tuesdays and Thursday nights from 6.30 till 9.30 (although pre and post class preparation usually meane an occupation time of from 6 till 10 p.m. This is a profit shared arrangement with Tawa College. Student feedback to date regarding the Men's Shed has been very positive.

Thanks to Members, Supervisors, and the Committee

None of the successes of the last year would have been possible without the commitment of the committee, supervisors, and members themselves to make the MenzShed Tawa a success, and so I thank you all.

<u>Safety First</u>

One of the most useful tools the Shed obtained, through a grant, was a Festool plunge saw. It enables 100% accurate, straight cuts to be made. The saw runs along an aluminium guide rail which keeps it on track. The tool came with a 1400mm guide rail. This allowed one to cut 2400mm x 1200mm sheets of ply width-wise. But you were out of luck if you wanted to cut the 2400mm sheet length-wise.

The Shed has now obtained a 1080mm extension rail with a pair of connectors. Now you can cut 2480mm lengths. There is a trick to joining the two rails to make sure they connect up straight.

1) Connect the two rails together using the two steel connector rods – make sure the fastening screws face upwards.

- 2) Do not push the rails against each leave about a 1mm gap.
- 3) Place the saw on the rails so that it straddles the gap.
- 4) Tighten the two aligning cams on the saw so that it pulls the two rails into alignment.

5) While the saw is still on the rail, tighten the four upwards-facing screws. (You may need to tilt the saw to get at one of the screws.)

- 6) Take the saw off, gently flip the rails over and tighten the four underneath screws.
- 7) The screws are steel, and the rails are aluminium, please take care not to overtighten the screws.

If you have not used this tool before, please get help from the Supervisor. It has a number of adjustments you need to be aware of.

Shed Vacuum Sawdust Collection System

Many people don't realise that the vacuum pipes have slide air gates. These are easy to spot – they are the black plastic devices mounted against the grey vacuum hose. So, they switch on the vacuum pump and assume vacuum is being applied to their tool, which it isn't.

To apply suction to the machine you are going to use, you simply pull on the right-angled tab on the slide gate and slide it out to its end-stop. Preferably only use one open gate at a time, but the system can probably handle two machines – like a table saw plus the sander. It won't work for two table saws, or a table saw and a router – both these machines create copious amounts of sawdust and need a good vacuum.



When you have finished working – please be a considerate kiwi and close the air gate.

Another point to note – when using any machine in the tool room, always switch on the external extraction fan. The sawdust extraction system will not trap all the very fine wood particulates floating in the air. These can cause serious damage to your lungs.

<u>Safety First</u>

Our machines are fitted with safety guards for a reason - <u>YOUR SAFETY</u> - *please make sure they are operational and working correctly*, if not report it immediately to the supervisor of the day and preferably not use m/c till fixed. The supervisor will have the authority to take m/c out of operation if necessasry. <u>Please make sure they are operational</u> *Urgent Plea,* we are looking for volunteers to man the stall at "Spring into Tawa", this should only entail a short period at our Table/Stall. Please contact committee member for details - its a lot of fun.
