Shared newsletter space

Following discussions with the committees of the Men's Shed and the Friends of the Tawa Bush Reserves (FOTBR) both organisations have agreed to share newsletter space and information of activities and events. The aim to get the profile of both groups to a wider audience, and hopefully share some members.

Community Education Woodwork Classes

The community education woodwork classes are in their third week with 12 students attending for three hours on both Tuesday and Thursday nights up until Thursday the 30th of March. The Men's Shed receives a portion of the fees for the use of our site and equipment. Each class has 12 students for a total of 24 individuals per week many of which eventually joined the men shed. The Wellington woodworkers Guild are also holding classes on Wednesday night so the shed is being very well utilised.

Parking space and Container Storage

Graeme Chamberlain organised the skateboard contracting company to clear the land adjacent to our parking sites. He organised a "Quid pro quo" and the men shed members stained all the wood products that now surround skateboard park, and in return they cleared the land opposite our building. Although Graham had a team of workers with him he organised both activities; so thanks very much Graham. - The overall aim is to increase parking space and negotiate with WCC to get a container on the site for extra storage. This negotiation is ongoing.



Parking Site Maintenance

We are currently negotiating with WCC on who should maintain the external site. So far some of the work has been done with members of the Friends of the Tawa Bush Reserve and now that we've cleared the extra land it would be a shame to have it revert back to grass.

Water storage tank for the Friends of the Tawa Bush Reserves

As part of the condition of having a propagation house available to the community within the confines of the rural fire depot the Friends of the Tawa Bush Reserve had to erect an independent water storage unit. They have obtained a 25,000-litre water tank and plan to work with the men shed members to locate the tank along the wall between the kitchen extension and the southern gate.

AGM



We have been successful in applying for a grant from St Davids Trust. The grant is to purchase a new wood turning lathe.

There will be a presentation to formally present the grant to the Tawa Menzshed, this will be attended by members to recieve the grant and to show examples of what we can now expect to produce.

This will enable us to further our wider community involvement with organisations such as **Wood Workers Guild**, **Tawa College** and others.
